INDICTMENT

The Jurors of the State of Maryland for the body of the City of Baltimore, do on their oath present that the aforesaid DEFENDANT:

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

At all times relevant to this Indictment:

- 1. Adam Lane CHAUDRY ("CHAUDRY") served as an Assistant State's Attorney in the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office in the Office's Homicide Division.
- CHAUDRY began his service with the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office as an Assistant State's Attorney on June 1, 2009 and was administered an oath on or about 10:00 AM by the Clerk of the Court on that date.
- On or about September 2015, CHAUDRY joined the Homicide Division of the Baltimore
 City State's Attorney's Office.
- 4. The Homicide Division of the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office routinely requests grand jury and trial subpoenas for information related to official investigations and prosecutions.

 As a member of the Homicide Division of the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office, CHAUDRY would routinely obtain or request grand jury and trial subpoenas.
- 5. On or about May 2005, CHAUDRY became engaged in a romantic relationship with VICTIM 1. VICTIM 1 and CHAUDRY terminated that relationship on or about January 2018.

- 6. VICTIM 1 was never the target of, nor involved in, an investigation or prosecution conducted by the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office.
- 7. On or about August 2017, CHAUDRY became engaged in a romantic relationship with VICTIM 2. VICTIM 2 and CHAUDRY terminated that relationship on or about September 2020.
- 8. VICTIM 2 was never the target of, nor involved in, an investigation or prosecution conducted by the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office.
- 9. VICTIM 1 had telephonic contact with VICTIM 3, VICTIM 4, and VICTIM 5. VICTIM
- 3, VICTIM 4, and VICTIM 5 were friends with VICTIM 1 and continued communication with VICTIM 1 after CHAUDRY and VICTIM 1 terminated their relationship.
- 10. VICTIM 3 was never the target of, nor involved in, an investigation or prosecution conducted by the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office.
- 11. VICTIM 4 was never the target of, nor involved in, an investigation or prosecution conducted by the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office.
- 12. VICTIM 5 was never the target of, nor involved in, an investigation or prosecution conducted by the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office.

- 101. On or about January 2018, VICTIM 1 terminated her romantic relationship with CHAUDRY. She conveyed to CHAUDRY that she did not want to have any communication with him. CHAUDRY then engaged in a course of conduct including, but not limited to, behavior listed in paragraphs 101-113 in addition to what has been incorporated above.
- 102. From January 3, 2019 until April 12, 2021 CHAUDRY issued subpoenas for VICTIM 1's phone records thirty-three (33) times.
- 103. From March 12, 2019, until April 12, 2021, CHAUDRY issued subpoenas for VICTIM 1's contacts, including VICTIM 3, VICTIM 4, and VICTIM 5, twenty-five (25) times.
- 104. On January 8, 2019, CHAUDRY sent VICTIM 1 flowers to her work address.
- 105. On February 14, 2019, CHAUDRY sent VICTIM 1 flowers to her work address.
- On March 4, 2019, VICTIM 1 responded to an email from CHAUDRY in which CHAUDRY asked if the two could talk. VICTIM 1 clearly and unambiguously stated: "It has been over a year now and I need you to move on. I was hoping that by ignoring the texts, calls, and flowers, you would understand how I feel, but now I will make it very clear...; Please do not send me any more flowers or anything else...; It makes me uncomfortable...; I asked you not to send anything to my mom, and you decided to send a card and flowers. It is too much and it needs to stop...; Please do not try to look through my Instagram pictures...; There is no future for us.; Please do not stop by my house or try to "run" into me anywhere else...; You need to let me go...; I need you to stop trying to contact me and send me gifts."
- 107. On December 7, 2020, CHAUDRY sent VICTIM 1 flowers to her home address.
- 108. On January 8, 2021, CHAUDRY sent VICTIM 1 flowers to her home address.
- 109. On February 22, 2019, CHAUDRY sent VICTIM 1's mother flowers to VICTIM 1's mother's address.

110. On March 21, 2019, CHAUDRY via email sent a request to an investigator at the Baltimore

City State's Attorney's Office to do an information work-up of VICTIM 1 and VICTIM 3,

including Maryland Vehicle Administration (MVA) records and digital images.

111. On or about December 2018 through March 2019, VICTIM 1 engaged in communications

and trips with VICTIM 3, VICTIM 4, and VICTIM 5 that required hotel stays. On March 26, 2019,

CHAUDRY, using his Baltimore City State's Attorney email address, exchanged emails with an

employee of a hotel that VICTIM 1 had called for reservations. CHAUDRY's emails referenced a

previous conversation between CHAUDRY and the hotel employee in which CHAUDRY

provided several names including VICTIM 1.

112. In an email addressed to CHAUDRY, the hotel employee stated, "Hello Mr. Chaudry.

Upon review of the three names you supplied, I was only able to find stays for [VICTIM 1] from

October 1, 2018 through March 22, 2019." The email stated VICTIM 1's specific dates of stay.

113. CHAUDRY responded to the email from his Baltimore City State's Attorney issued email

address on the same day, "Per our conversation, I have taken the liberty of scanning & attaching

with this correspondence the MVA digital image(s). the [sic] 2nd Vehicle [sic] in question I wish

to verify is a [CHAUDRY provided a description of a vehicle operated by VICTIM 3]."

COUNT 81 - STALKING

114. From on or about January 3, 2019, until April 12, 2021, at Baltimore City, Maryland,

ADAM L. CHAUDRY did stalk VICTIM 1.

relationship. CHAUDRY continued to engage in a course of conduct he commenced during their

relationship including, but not limited to, behavior listed in paragraphs 117-123 in addition to what

has been incorporated above.

118. From February 22, 2019, while CHAUDRY and VICTIM 2 were still dating, until April

12, 2021, CHAUDRY issued subpoenas for VICTIM 2's phone records six (6) times.

119. During the relationship CHAUDRY would tell VICTIM 2 information related to her family

that she had asked him not to access and that she believed he discovered through official channels.

VICTIM 2 told CHAUDRY to stop whatever he was doing.

120. On or about December 8, 2020, CHAUDRY subpoenaed jail calls made by a relative of

VICTIM 2. These included personal conversations between VICTIM 2 and her relative.

121. On or about December 21, 2020, CHAUDRY subpoenaed all visitor and call logs for a

relative of VICTIM 2.

VICTIM 2 called 911 on January 31, 2021 at 19:48. CHAUDRY subpoenaed phone 122.

records for VICTIM 2 for the period of January 1, 2021 through February 8, 2021 on February 8,

2021.

123. On or about February 24, 2021, CHAUDRY sent a letter on Baltimore City State's

Attorney Letterhead requesting a CAD report and 911 recording for a call for service made by

VICTIM 2, stating in the letter that the request "is pertinent to a legitimate law enforcement

126. The Grand Jury incorporates paragraphs 1- 12 and 61-67 and 100-113 and 116-123 of this

Indictment as though fully set forth herein.

127. On or about July 9, 2018, CHAUDRY began exchanging text messages with a personal

acquaintance about money the acquaintance believed she had loaned to one of her ex-boyfriends.

128. On November 6, 2018, CHAUDRY texted the personal acquaintance, in part, "...I'll have my investigators run and check on him [VICTIM 6] to see where he is staying. I can likely sending [sic] Target letter to both him and [name of VICTIM 6's sports agent] indicating the state is investigating the matter in a criminal capacity."

- 129. On or about December 20, 2018, at 4:22 p.m., CHAUDRY sent an email from his official Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office email address to VICTIM 6's personal email address.
- 130. The email read, in part, "In Re Grand Jury Investigation * State of Maryland". Good afternoon. This correspondence is to serve as notice to you that the Office of the State's Attorney has opened a criminal investigation into the failure of remittance of payment. Attached you will find more information as to the same."
- 131. Attached to the email was a formal letter written on Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office official letter head. The letter read, in part, "I am writing to notify you that the Office of the State's Attorney for Baltimore City has opened a criminal investigation into the failure of remittance of payment pursuant to an agreement entered into with a [Personal Acquaintance full name]. Should both parties reach an agreement for an alternative resolution for which the amount outstanding \$10,000.00 U.S. currency is recovered in full; the State will note the same as satisfactorily closed." The letter is addressed from "Marilyn J. Mosby, States Attorney for Baltimore City" and is signed by CHAUDRY.
- 132. At no time was there an official investigation by the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Office into any of the allegations related to VICTIM 6.

COUNT 85 - EXTORTION

133. On or about December 20, 2018, ADAM LANE CHAUDRY did attempt to obtain, by

threat of prosecution in the form of a target letter, \$10,000 having the value of at least \$10,000 but

less than \$100,000 from VICTIM 6, in violation of CR 3- 701(b) of the Annotated Code of

Maryland.
