Main Purpose Of Job

This position conducts criminal investigations regarding violations of Maryland law for the Office of the State Prosecutor and reports directly to the Chief Investigator. This position provides expertise regarding investigations involving special victims matters, including sexual assaults and domestic violence, and is responsible for related interviews. report writing, research, assistance with trial prep and any other duties deemed necessary to complete an investigation.

POSITION DUTIES

Responsibilities will include advising other investigators on aspects of special victims' investigations; interviewing potential witnesses, victims and suspects; collecting, preserving, and analyzing physical and documentary evidence; preparing and participating in the execution of search warrants and other legal process; assisting prosecutors with trial preparation; and testifying in grand jury proceedings, criminal trials, and other hearings.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education: Substantial experience in investigations or a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in criminal justice or related field, including substantial experience with special victims' issues or investigations, is required.

Experience: Five years of experience in criminal investigations, including a minimum of three years' experience conducting special victims-related investigations. This experience must have involved one or more of the following: interviewing potential witnesses, victims, and suspects; collecting, preserving, and analyzing physical and documentary evidence; preparing and participating in the execution of search warrants and other legal process; assisting prosecutors with trial preparation; and testifying in grand jury proceedings, criminal trials, and other hearings.
